- Research-type, team project based on history and facts and can be presented in any format, e.g. recital, debate, video, slides, drama, poster or a combination thereof. Your own evidence-based conclusions are most important. Evidence collected through primary research is preferred.
- Submission could be in English or Chinese, or a combination of both.
- Faculty advisors are permitted, but the students must conduct the research and do the presentation.
- Finalists will be invited to present their work to a panel of judges.

- January 1, 2019 to January 31, 2019 Submission of application

  - A) Names of students, grades/years, high school.
  - B) Contact information of the team leader such as address, e-mail and telephone number.
  - C) An abstract (two pages maximum) on how you plan to conduct your research and present your conclusions.
- On or before March 1, 2019 Submission of project (rubric attached for your information) Information on submission will be provided upon acceptance of application.
- March 30, 2019 Notification to finalists for presentation
- April 19, 2019 Finalists to submit complete presentation to NJCCSF
- April 27, 2019, Saturday (9:00am-2:00pm) Bethany Hall, Seton Hall University Finalists Presentations & Awards Ceremony
  - 12-minute presentation in English, Chinese or combination of both.
  - Judges may ask questions.
