Co-host the 16th Chinese Cultural Project Contest**

Topic: How Does Artificial Intelligence (AI) Impact the Learning of Chinese Language and Culture?

**1st Place: \$700 (1 team)
2nd Place: \$300 (2 teams)
3rd Place: \$200 (2 teams)**

Objective of the contest: To promote the understanding and appreciation of Chinese culture and heritage.

Contestant eligibility: Any high school student teams who are studying full time at an accredited high school and are in grades 9 through 12. A team must have at least 2 members but not more than 5 members.

Project format:

- Research-type, team project based on history and facts and can be presented in any format, e.g., recital, debate, video, slides, drama, poster or a combination thereof. Your own evidence-based conclusions are most important. Evidence collected through primary research is preferred.
- Submission could be in English or Chinese, or a combination of both.
- Faculty advisors are permitted, but the students must conduct the research AND do the project and presentation completely on their own.
- Finalists will be invited to present their work to a panel of judges.

Timeline:

- **January 1, 2024 to Sunday January 28, 2024 - Submission of application**
All applicants are required to e-mail the following information to njccsf@gmail.com.
A) Names of students, grades/years, high school.
B) Contact information of the team leader such as address, e-mail and telephone number.
C) An abstract (1 page) on how you plan to conduct your research and present your conclusions.
- **On or before Sunday March 17, 2024 - Submission of project**
Information on submission will be provided upon acceptance of application.
- **March 31, 2024 – Notification to finalists for presentation**
- **April 7, 2024 – Finalists to submit complete presentation to NJCCSF**
- **April 13, 2024, Saturday (9:00am-2:00pm) – Bethany Hall, Seton Hall University
Finalists Presentations & Awards Ceremony**
- 12-minute presentation in English, Chinese or combination of both.
- Judges may ask questions.
