**Topic: How Will American and Chinese Approaches to Artificial Intelligence Shape the  
Future of Teenagers?**

**1<sup>st</sup> Place: \$700 (1 team)  
2<sup>nd</sup> Place: \$300 (2 teams)  
3<sup>rd</sup> Place: \$200 (2 teams)**

**Objective of the contest:** To promote the understanding and appreciation of Chinese culture and heritage.

**Contestant eligibility:** Any high school student teams who are studying full time at an accredited high school and are in grades 9 through 12. A team must have at least 2 members but not more than 5 members.

**Project format:**

- Research-type, team project based on history and facts and can be presented in any format, e.g., recital, debate, video, slides, drama, poster or a combination thereof. Your own evidence-based conclusions are most important. Evidence collected through primary research is preferred.
- Submission could be in English or Chinese, or a combination of both.
- Faculty advisors are permitted, but the students must conduct the research AND do the project and presentation completely on their own.
- Finalists will be invited to present their work to a panel of judges.

**Timeline:**

- **January 2, 2026 to Saturday January 31, 2026 - Submission of application**

A) Names of students, grades/years, high school. A team of students can be from different high schools.  
B) Contact information of the team leader such as address, e-mail and telephone number.  
C) An abstract (1 page) on how you plan to conduct your research and present your conclusions.

- **April 18, 2026, Saturday (9:00am-1:00pm) – Bethany Hall, Seton Hall University

  - 12-minute presentation in English, Chinese or combination of both.
  - Judges may ask questions.
